

Conditions of Entry



1. No Shows / Withdrawals

Athletes are asked if having entered a competition and decide not to start, to please inform the organiser as soon as possible to ensure the smooth running of competitions. Withdrawals will not be charged however, those who do not inform the organiser may still be charged for their entry.

2. Substitutions

A horse can be substituted at any time until it has competed in the relevant class.

3. Late Entries

Late entries may be accepted at the organiser's discretion.

4. Combined Competitions

When entering competitions such as a Foxhunter/1.20m Open, athletes must state which section they intend to compete in. If no section is specified then athletes will automatically be entered into the "Open" section, which could result in missed double clears and/or fines.

5. Additional Conditions

- 5.1. By entering for any competition during this event, the athlete recognises they are participating in a risk sport.
- 5.2. The decision of the jury is final.
- 5.3. The organiser reserves the right to limit the number of entries in accordance with rule 75.8.
- 5.4. In the event of insufficient starters in any competition, the OC reserves the right to withhold lower prizes in accordance with rule 76.6.
- 5.5. The organiser will not accept any legal liability for accidents, loss, damage, injury or illness to horses, owners, grooms, riders, spectators or any property owned by them.
- 5.6. Any person responsible for a stallion as owner, lessee, authorised agent or rider must adhere to all British Showjumping rules regarding stallions, in particular rules 82.20 and 102.12.
- 5.7. Athletes must be dressed suitably as outlined in rule 101.
- 5.8. An objection that is based on the judging of any competition must be made in writing and lodged with the organiser within 30 minutes of the competitors leaving the arena following the presentation of awards. The objection must be accompanied by a cash deposit of £100. Upon receipt of a written objection and deposit lodged, the President of the Ground Jury will adjudicate whenever possible. If this is not possible, the objection will be referred to British Showjumping for consideration by the Chief Executive. The deposit is forfeited unless the objection is upheld or it is decided that there were good and reasonable grounds for the lodging of an objection. Should an objection be upheld in relation to the result of a class, the deposit will be refunded and the results will be amended accordingly. Unless the objection is upheld, there is no appeal from such a decision.
- 5.9. Fences in the warm-up arena will be in accordance with rule 122. Practice fences may not be higher than 10cms above the stated height of the competition in the schedule.
- 5.10. Athletes are expected to parade mounted for awards unless prior permission is obtained from the jury not to do so. If permission is not obtained prizes may be withheld.
